

An introduction to the Project "Help me!": Let's take a guided tour of our project

"Help me!", the title has never been more appropriate for an Erasmus+ project that deals with natural disasters and how many we have seen in these 3 years: floods, heat waves, fires, earthquakes; ever more extreme, frequent, and sudden climatic events, so intense and devastating that they always catch us unprepared. And many of us have been directly involved in some of them during the implementation of this project: two earthquakes in Turkey, numerous floods in Italy and Croatia, the devastating fires of recent summers. I would also add the recent Russian-Ukrainian conflict, an even greater threat for all of Europe and especially for two of our partners bordering Ukraine, Poland and Romania. The very beginning of the conflict, last March 2022, forced us to cancel the second mobility in Romania. The Covid-19 pandemic was a disastrous event that forced us home for almost two years, during which we continued to keep the project alive by holding online project team meetings, some of the planned activities, and promoting the exchange of ideas and friendship among students through dedicated social apps.

Since the spreading of the Covid-19 pandemic had made any possible actions or activities uncertain, the implementation of our "Help me!" project started in September 2020 with a series of formal meeting at national level, and of informal online meetings among partners, a whatsapp group was created for fast communication, emails were used for more formal communication and exchange of documents. During the online kick off meeting, the project overview and overall goals were presented, how they fit with each school's goals was discussed, clear expectations regarding roles and responsibilities were established. The project coordinator and the most experienced teachers volunteered and offered their help to the less experienced one. The relationship among partners was friendly and collaborative since the very first beginning. Each partner was available for work and provided suggestions, comments, etc. From September to December 2020 each Institution had time to create its own management project teams and promote the project at local and school level. The project website, Facebook, e-Twinning, Instagram and Twitter pages were created by teachers and students, the Logo Contest (29th November-11th December 2020) and an initial survey on the students and school staff's knowledge of natural disasters (15th-20th December 2020) were conducted, all the students and teachers involved in order to arouse interest in the project. They were invited to join it and a dedicated Club (Help me Club) was set up. The students started making country and school presentations to be uploaded on social platforms and apps.

All these activities were made official on 12th February 2021 with an online partners' meeting during which a tentative timeline was set for the first students online meeting and the workshop on the eTwinning platform; roles and responsibilities formally stated. The minutes of the official meetings have been written and shared among the partners, Google drive and a dedicated Google classroom created by the project coordinator for internal use in addition to the project pages above mentioned on the main social apps and e-Twinning platform for its promotion and dissemination.

Now, we would like to take you on a guided tour of our project "Help me!" and its outcomes, so please relax and enjoy it!

The Logo Contest

If the project launch at school and on the media made it popular among parents, students, teachers, and school staff, the "logo contest" involved our students actively. They were enthusiastic and felt the importance of the topic they were dealing with. Specific rules were agreed upon among the partners and the following guidelines shared with the students:

Logo Contest Guidelines

After introducing the project 'Help me!' to the students that are directly involved in the project and discussed its objectives and topics tackled, each partner school asks them to design coherent/relevant logos. The students are told to feel free to use their skills creatively and get inspired by the project. The logo designs submitted are collected by the contact teachers and posted on the project dedicated social media: Facebook page, e-Twinning page, website, the project WhatsApp group when necessary. Each partner creates a google form displaying all the logo designs of the partner countries except its own logo designs and shares it with the partners for them to check if all the logo designs have been included in the document. After approval, the partner school sends the form to its own students for them to vote.

Contest rules

1. Each student can vote only one logo design.
2. The logo designs that gets more votes are called finalists. After all the students from the five partner schools have voted there will be from one to five finalists.
3. The finalists are displayed in one single google form that is shared by all the partner schools.
4. The google document is sent to all the students/a selected number of students from the partner schools/the contact teachers from the partner schools for them to vote.
5. The logo that gets the highest number of votes is the contest winner and becomes the Project Logo. It will be displayed on all the official papers, website, social media, announcements, etc.

The students from all the partner countries created 46 logos; the choice was made by Google form. There were two rounds for the choice of the Project Logo:

- round 1: 155 students voted their favourite logo choosing from 46 logo designs submitted by the students of partner countries;
- round 2: 52 students voted their favourite logo choosing from the 5 logos selected in the first round.

The winning logo shows our planet suffering because of the manifold disasters, other logos are interesting as well and witness the interest of our students for the issues connected with climate change and extreme disasters. Some of them are posted below.







Natural Disasters: an initial survey

An initial survey (15th–20th December 2020) was carried out to arouse awareness on the dangers of natural disasters and curiosity about how we can cope with them, by asking our students, colleagues and school staff about natural disasters that might occur in their country/region, their causes, if they can be prevented and what we can do to prevent them, if protection against natural disasters is taught in class, if they know how to perform medical first aid in case of a natural disaster and what action should be taken in case of a natural disaster, if there is a disaster management or emergency plan for the area they live in, if they know about laws or policies that deal with disaster management in their country and the health issues connected to disasters, if they or their families have ever been affected by a disaster.

Do you live in an area which is heavily crowded?

According to the 252 people that answered the questions, earthquakes, wildfires, volcanic eruptions and floods are the disasters that are most likely to happen because of climate change (78.2%) and pollution (46.4%).

Disasters can be prevented by taking care of our planet, reducing pollution, respecting the environment. 97 people are very much concerned about the disasters that might occur in their areas.

43.6% thinks that the issue is not enough taught in schools and only 23.4% knows how to perform medical first aid in case of a natural disaster.

44.6% doesn't know what to do in case of a disaster; 54% is not aware of a disaster management or emergency plan for the area they live in; 44.8% doesn't know about laws or policies that deal with disaster management.

Only 11.7% live in heavily crowded areas; luckily 75.5% has never been affected by a disaster.

Regarding the health issues that might occur severe injuries, disease outbreaks, water contamination, water and food shortage, damage to hospitals have been chosen.

18 March 2021 - Online Workshop


"A bridge between eTwinning and Erasmus+ projects"

C1: 23-27 May, 2022

ISTITUTO DI ISTRUZIONE SECONDARIA SUPERIORE "MANDRALISCA"

Liceo Classico - Cefalù, Italy

The LTTA activities were divided into two sessions: during the curricular hours, 64 students, organized in interest/skills groups (Techno Group, Art Group, Writing Group) produced art works (posters, videos, infographics in English and partners' languages, interviews, LTTA journal, short articles, digital games and school and project topics presentations slideshows). The teachers acted as tutors and advisors and collaborated in the documentation of the project. The afternoons were dedicated to guided tours and cultural events.

1ST DAY (23 May 2022)

It started with a guided tour of school, welcome meeting with students of 'Club Help me', school staff and teachers, continued with some ice-breaking activities and the 'Let's meet up!' activity: 2 students from the partner countries and two Italian students, acting as facilitators, spent 1 hour with the students of each of the 12 classes of L. Classico, presented their countries and schools, the project 'Help me' and were involved in an intercultural exchange on their cultures, lifestyles and topic of interest. The students were then organized into groups according to their interests and skills, team leaders were appointed. In the afternoon the group was taken on a guided tour of Cefalù with Italian students acting as guides.

2ND DAY (24 May 2022)

It started with a welcome meeting with IIS Mandralisca Headmistress, Ms. Daniela Crimi. Then students worked in groups on the production of art works. Lunch was hosted by Hotel and Catering School Mandralisca. In the afternoon, there was a guided tour of the Duomo di Cefalù and Osterio Magno. The day finished with a guided tour of Castelbuono town.

3RD DAY (25 May 2022)

It was dedicated to the guided tour of the historic center of Palermo: the Arab-Norman Itinerary and UNESCO Heritage, the Royal Palace and Palatine Chapel, the Cathedral, Pretoria Square etc.

4TH DAY (26 May 2022)

In the morning the students worked in groups. The afternoon workshop was on 'Handling world-class emergency: school building evacuation drills and first aid practice', the theme of this mobility: the main disasters of our region, causes and consequences were illustrated; earthquake and guided evacuation drills were simulated, first aid techniques were shown by experts, then performed by some students. A member of the Cefalù Civil Protection team illustrated the role of the Civil Protection, presented some of the most common cases of natural disasters and answered the questions of the participants. The activity was appreciated by all the participants and was successful among the students despite the scorching heat.

5TH DAY (27 May 2022)

It was the time to display the work the students did during the week and present it to the others, followed by the awarding ceremony: students and teachers received their certificate of attendance - and the feedback survey. Europass mobility certificates were also issued for all the partners.

Macin, Romania

26th September 2022

In the morning we were fortunate to be hosted by Romanian Red Cross officials who presented, in a very practical manner, some rescue techniques and disaster management methods. In the afternoon, we had a walk in the old part of Bucharest and we ended with a visit in the Village Museum where all the students were able to admire old Romanian traditional houses.

27th September 2022

Today we welcomed our partners in Gheorghe Munteanu Murgoci High School, where after the greeting from Mrs Olguta Bilea, our principal, we saw great Romanian traditional songs and dances. We had a tour of our school and visited the kindergardens. All partners presented their town, school and shared traditional products from their countries. After lunch we went to the town hall of Macin and we met the mayor. Afterwards we have been to the oldest Orthodox church , Mestan Aga and the park where we could admire The Danube.

28th September 2022

Today was a great project day! We went to Tulcea where we had the opportunity to meet the prefect and subprefect of the county of Tulcea and part of their staff that ensures an efficient management in emergency situations. Afterwards we met the Inspector in charge of all European projects from our region, Mrs Felicia Rusu. Then we went to the Department of Emergency Situations where our students were lucky to see all the equipment they have and try some of it as well. Our beautiful day ended with a visit in the Biodiversity Museum and aquarium where students learnt about the formation of the Danube Delta, about animals and how people used to live in this area.

29th September 2022

Today we started the day doing presentation about the topic of our mobility, Survival Kit. Afterwards our partners took part at the drill we organised in case of an earthquake together with the Firefighters' Department of Macin. The afternoon activities were made in groups, students created a feedback questionnaire, a feedback presentation, a few pages of the project 's magazine, a few pages of the dictionary of terms used in case of emergency and a flyer of the survival kit everyone should have in their homes.

The day ended with a feast and the certificates ceremony.

30th September 2022

This morning we students presented their work, all the things they have done during the week. So together we filled the feedback questionnaire, a ppt to summarize the meeting, a flyer of the survival kit, a dictionary of terms for emergency situations and a project magazine. Some of them will be continued in the next LTTAs.

3. Describe the content, methodology and the results of this activity.

1. Who were the participants in the activity (including local participants)?

In this mobility there were involved the following: 6 students and 2 teachers from Italy, 6 students and 2 teachers from Croatia, 6 students and 2 teachers from Turkey, 6 students and 2 teachers from Poland , 50 students and teachers directly, local and regional authorities ,representatives of the Tulcea School Inspectorate, Romanian Red Cross trainers, Firefighters, parents, all the other students of the Romanian school(earthquake drill).

2. How was this activity related to or integrated with the normal activities of the involved schools?

Most of the project activities on this week were integrated with the normal activities of the Romanian school. Students from Croatia, Turkey, Poland and Italy interacted with the Romanian ones during classes and their breaks as well. They could witness how some classes are taught, how Romanian teachers act in class. They had the opportunity to participate altogether in an earthquake drill, see how they all react and they have to do in such an unpredictable, yet dangerous, situation. The Erasmus+ group created a flyer of the emergency kit which will be used by all the students, teachers and parents of the host school and not only.

3. How did the participation in this activity benefit the involved participants?

Activities organized during the exchange have improved students' abilities such as:

- Emergency and first aid capabilities
- Team work skills
- They were able to learn what they can do when they encounter any kind of disaster (earthquake and flood especially)
- Digital skills
- Collaboration and communication skills
- Increased creativity and better English communication
- A sense of cultural awareness and identity

The goal was to have more responsible students and young people in social life and enable them to understand their responsibilities, as well as students developed some degree of flexibility or adaptability, expression and the ability to maintain a perspective.

Teachers benefited from visiting the different school involved in the project and have recognized their way of organizing, they have learnt about the host school's projects, emergency and the first aid practices in school, IT equipment and technology in the classroom. They have learnt about the different methods they can be used in other school.

12 December 2022

15 December 2022

On Thursday all students made presentations on Emergency Movement Plans. Next they did a workshop with different themes and created evacuation plans. The presentations were comprehensive and interesting, because each group presented their topics in a different ways.

The workshop was interrupted by the evacuation drill carried out by the firefighters and the police. In the afternoon all students created a flyer on the topic of the meeting, continued the project magazine and the dictionary. The meeting ended with the Certificate Ceremony.

16 December 2022

It was a departure day. All students from Italy, Romania, Croatia, Turkey and Poland presented the results of their week's work: the flyer, project magazine and dictionary. They have also presented the results of the LTTA's survey and took part in the kahoot game prepared by the Polish students

27 March 2023

In the morning , We were welcomed in Pakmaya Ülkü Hizal Anadolu Lisesi with an official welcoming ceremony. The opening session continued with ice-breaking activities to let the students get to know each other better. Then, all partners made presentations about their town, school and country. After lunch, we participated in Ebru Workshop which is a traditional paper marbling art of Turkey.

28March 2023

It was a cultural excursion day. We went to Selçuk to visit House of Virgin Mary and Ephesus Ancient City. Later on, we went to Şirince which is a traditional Turkish-Greek village where we had lunch.

29 March 2023

The day started with the presentations of each country on the topic of the mobility, Emergency Training Program. After the lunch break, students were divided into international groups as Art group, Diary Group, Vlog group and Emergency Kit improvement group. DESCRİBE THE CONTENT, METHODOLOGY AND THE RESULTS OF THIS ACTİVİTY

1. Who were the participants in the activity (including local participants)?

People involved in this mobility: 6 students and 2 teachers from each partner country, 50 students and 15 teachers directly, local and regional authorities, representatives of Fire Department of İzmir Metropolitan Municipality, parents, all the other students of the Turkish school.

2. How was this activity related to or integrated with the normal activities of the involved schools?

Most of the project activities were integrated with the normal activities of the Turkish school. Students of partner countries met the Turkish students and participated in their classes. They had a chance to witness how common subjects like Maths, English are taught in a different country. During the breaks, students got to know each other while chatting and doing some sport activities.



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3. How did the participation in this activity benefit the involved participants?

Activities carried out during the week improved students' abilities such as;

- Emergency capabilities ; how to react during any kind of natural disaster
- Team work skills

15 May 2023

On Monday we were welcomed at the secondary school "Mate Blažine" in Labin. The students had a lot of fun with some ice-breaking activities. Afterwards they gave their presentations about their city, country and school. This was followed by a walk through the old town of Labin. After a pizza at the second best pizzeria in Croatia, the students and professors toured the old town of Labin.

16 May 2023

Croatian LTTA Day 2 On Tuesday 16 May we visited the largest town in Istria, Pula, where we were introduced to the FIRESPELL project (FOSTERING IMPROVED REACTION OF CROSSBORDER EMERGENCY SERVICES AND PREVENTION INCREASING SAFETY LEVEL) The project was presented by the Head of the Department of Nature and Environmental Protection of Istria County and the head of the FIRESPELL project for Istria County, Bruno Kostelić. The overall objective of FIRESPELL is to improve the capacity of emergency service organisations to increase cross-border effectiveness in managing natural and man-made disasters, to reduce the exposure of the population to the effects of hazards and to increase the safety of the Croatian and Italian Adriatic basin by improving emergency prevention and management measures and tools. <https://www.italy-croatia.eu/web/firespill>.

As part of the EU FIRESPELL project, Istria County acquired valuable equipment to prevent the spread of marine pollution, namely 500 metres of protective dams and additional equipment to prevent the spread of hydrocarbons and other pollutants during adverse marine and coastal events. This was followed by a rainy tour of the Arena and Forum of Pula. In the afternoon we visited the Istrian town of Rovinj and its famous Church of St Euphemia.

17 May 2023

On the third day of mobility we visited the Labin fire station in Dubrova, near Labin. The presentation of the station was followed by a demonstration exercise on rescuing an injured person from a car in a ravine. The exercise was carried out jointly by firefighters and an ambulance team. This was followed by an exercise to extinguish a burning car. A student from each province took on the role of a firefighter. This was followed by a first aid workshop organised by the Labin Red Cross. The workshop was led by students from the Labin High School Before lunch, we walked through the famous sculpture park. It is one of the most beautiful Croatian sculpture parks and offers unique moments of art and nature in an open-air gallery. It covers more than 33 hectares of land, partly surrounded by dry stone walls, with natural valleys and plateaus and a rich and diverse Mediterranean flora.

18 May 2023

On the fourth day of mobility, the students gave presentations on the worst natural disasters in their countries in the last 100 years. Afterwards they were divided into 5 teams. They continued working on the project materials created during the previous mobilities: Natural Disaster Dictionary, the book, a quiz on emergency teams and a survival manual in case of natural disasters. In addition, a group created a digital photo narrative about mobility in Croatia. There was a joint lunch prepared by our school's catering company and cake donated by Bar Pozzo Littorio from Labin.

19 May 2023

The last day of mobility was dedicated to packing up. As 2 teams had to leave early, the Turkish, Polish and Croatian teams were accompanied for one hour by the 3rd grade students of a grammar school, who worked in groups and talked about their cultures, customs and education systems in their respective countries. In the second part of the morning, the Turkish and Polish students were guided by the Croatian team, who showed them the classrooms, workshops, the school kitchen, laboratories and the library.

Describe the content, methodology and the results of this activity.

1. Who were the participants in the activity (including local participants)?

People involved in this mobility:

6 students and 2 teachers from each partner country as follows: Italy, Poland and Turkey and 8 students and 2 teachers from Romania. As regards to the students from the Croatian team, all students who participated in the 4 mobilities took part in activities in Labin divided in groups each day. As for the local authorities, we collaborated with the Red Cross, Fire Department in Labin and Emergency medical services (EMS) as well as the Department of Nature and Environmental Protection of Istria County.

2. How was this activity related to or integrated with the normal activities of the involved schools?

The aim is to raise awareness of the importance of emergency drills and to embed them in schools. In addition, pupils are to be familiarised with the scope of activities of the individual emergency teams. In addition, lesson plans on the topic of this mobility will be created, which can later be used by all participating countries.

3. How did the participation in this activity benefit the involved participants?

All activities were closely linked to the sub-theme of this mobility (emergency teams). Both students and teachers had the opportunity to get to know the field of activity of each of the teams mentioned in question 1. In the case of the fire brigade, the head of the fire brigade spoke about their tasks, the organisation of the work and the cooperation with the police, EMS and the Red Cross. It was especially emphasised how important the cooperation of all emergency teams is for a successful operation. Representatives of the Red Cross joined in with their share of responsibility, as did EMS. To reinforce the theory, they organised an exercise to practise the much needed cooperation between emergency teams. After pushing a car into a ravine from which an injured student had been pulled out and placed in the Red Cross van, they set the car on fire and the firefighters (some students volunteered) put it out. The students not only understood the importance of coordination, but were also able to try it out for themselves.

In the last mobility, the students continued to work on the projects they had started in the first mobility, in each mobility until the last one, where we continued where we left off and prepared everything to finish the project. In this way, the students learned to work together in international teams.


#Erasmusdays and IDDRR: 13-14 October 2022

On 13th and 14th October 2022, all the partner schools - Croatia, Italy, Poland, Romania and Turkey - of Erasmus project 'Help me!', participated in the #EramusDays 2022 and in the the International Day for Disaster Risk Reduction.

The title of the event was "Early disaster warning systems and emergency plans": 2 days to celebrate #Erasmusdays and participate in the International Day for Disaster Risk Reduction.

The members of the "Help me Club" reported to their school mates on our recent mobility to Macin, Romania. Our schools students and teachers were involved in presentations and debates on the importance of early disaster warning systems and emergency plans. The "Sendai Framework", videos and info from the 'International Day for Disaster Risk Reduction' webpage were used as well as the outputs produced by our students so far (infographics, survival kit folder, ppts). Our students will report on our recent mobility to Romania, on survival kits.

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Report on Surveys: why schools need to include lesson plans on natural disasters and emergency education in the school curricula

Before the mobility to Turkey all the partners agreed on conducting an intermediate survey on the effectiveness of our project in terms of knowledge and skills and on the importance of dealing with the topic “natural disasters” in schools. The surveys were carried out from 14th to 24th March 2023 by means of google forms or interviews (Poland).

Schools in general provide teachers, students and school staff with school evacuation plans and first aid kits; some schools have earthquake bags on every floor and drills are held every semester but all of them should do more.

Here is a summary of their answers:

- most students and teachers stated that the topic of natural disasters, the rules of conduct and procedures to be implemented, evacuation plans, emergency plans, survival kits, emergency response, the role of civil protection, have been covered during the implementation of the “Help me” project, mostly by the English teachers but also by the science teachers;
- most of them have never taken a course on “Emergency Response” organised by their school and would like to know how to behave in case of a disastrous event and how they can help a classmate who has suffered injuries or damage of some kind;
- they do not think their schools are properly structured and organised to deal with an emergency;
- 98% think that the school should deal more with action plans in case of a natural disaster;
- 100% think that every student should learn the basics of first aid as part of the regular curriculum; simulations of evacuations should be held more frequently and that their school should help them learn how to deal with a catastrophic event – flood, fire, earthquake, whirlwind, etc. – by talking more about the subject, taking specific courses, organizing meetings and workshops with experts;
- first aid training should be provided from a young age.



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



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Project Evaluation

Soon after the end of the LTTAs, evaluation surveys were conducted from 29th to 31st May 2023 to get feedback on the way our project had been implemented and on its results and success. Two separate sets of questionnaire were prepared, one for the students and one for the teachers involved in the project with different questions. Both questionnaires can be viewed by scanning the QR codes below:



STUDENTS' FEEDBACK AND EVALUATION

Students were mostly motivated by getting to know different countries and cultures, opportunities to acquire new experience and new skills and improving language skills.

Most students indicated that the opportunities you had never had before participating in the project were making friends with students abroad cooperating with students from other countries; travelling abroad and attending classes in a school abroad.

Travel experiences, sightseeing other countries, getting to know other cultures and traditions and improving language skills were the points that most students enjoyed about working on the project.

Most of the students have pointed that this project met all their expectations.

Students stated that earthquake, wildfire, flood avalanche, landslide, and droughts mostly occurred in their country/region.

58 students stated their opinion about what the health related issues could happen when a disaster struck, among them: different types of injuries, broken bones, death, disease, famine, mental health problems, psychological problems, respiratory infections, heart attack, epidemics, etc.

Most of the students think that natural disaster can not be prevented from happening but people can be prepared and get crucial precautions before they happen.

Most of the students stated that they became informed about how to protect themselves in the case of a natural disaster; basic first aid practices; disaster management in their countries and the precautions that should be taken in the case of an emergency.

About the implementation and design of the project; most of the students indicated Teachers pointed that the field trips, workshops and the presentations about natural disasters, and disaster management were useful and relevant; the group works were efficient to understand the topics of the project. Most of the students stated that their knowledge and experience about natural disasters and emergency training has improved after participating in this project.

After the project meetings, students mostly gave presentations about mobility to other countries; wrote feedback about project partner meetings experiences; and shared their experiences on social media.

About the organization and partnership of the project; students mostly stated that the meetings were effective for their ability of communication and development of their socio-cultural knowledge about other countries; activities were useful for the development of group work. Most of the students pointed out that free time activities fulfilled their expectations.



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TEACHERS' FEEDBACK AND EVALUATION

Teachers were mostly motivated by opportunities to acquire new experience and new skills and getting to know different countries and cultures.

They mostly enjoyed getting to know other cultures and traditions and comparing different systems of education.

All teachers have pointed that this project met all their expectations.

Teachers mostly become informed about the Emergency Institutions of their country /other countries; how to protect themselves in the case of a natural disaster and basic first aid practices.

Most teachers think that “Natural disasters, emergency management and training” should be included in Geography lessons.

About the implementation and design of the project, all teachers indicated that they were informed about travel, accommodation etc. before the meeting from host partner, responding in time; the general organization of the meetings was efficient; the different types of activities were balanced; the meetings fulfilled the established objectives and personal expectations. Teachers pointed that the field trips, workshops and the presentations about natural disasters, and disaster management were useful and relevant; the group works were efficient to understand the topics of the project.

After the project meetings teachers mostly shared their experiences on social media; gave presentations about the mobility to other countries, prepared school notice board and wrote feedback about project partner meetings experiences.

About the partnership of the project all teachers indicated that the meetings were useful for the development of socio - cultural knowledge about different countries and they felt motivated to continue working on an Erasmus+ project in the future. Most teachers think that the activities and the meetings were effective to their ability of communication with others and for development of team work. All of them recommended to take part in the Erasmus+ Projects to other teachers.

Teachers' opinions about the best practices of the project were: having roles and responsibilities clearly stated and complied with by all the partners, learning how to act during an emergency, visiting the Fire Departments and Red Cross, , the opportunity to make a work experience abroad, working as a team.

Finally. regarding the best practices of the implementation of the project, the teachers' opinions are: the kick-off meeting to present the overall goals of the project and how it fits with each school's goals, the projects overview and timeline, establish clear expectations regarding roles and responsibilities, comparison of before and after ideas on natural disasters and first aid, watching people while they are giving first aid, participating in emergency and first aid situations wearing firefighters/civil protection clothes to understand them, the workshops and drills carried out during the mobilities with doctors and nurses, firefighters, Civil Protection and Red Cross staff, the genially games, the survival guide.



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Best Practices

According to the project coordinators and based on the students' and teachers' opinions expressed in the project evaluation survey, examples of best practices in the implementation of "Help me!" project are:

- the kick-off meetings (at national and European level) during which the overview and overall goals of the project were presented and how they fit with each school's goals discussed, expectations regarding roles and responsibilities were clearly stated and complied with by all the partners, and a timeline was set;
- comparisons of before and after ideas on natural disasters and first aid were made possible by means of surveys and open discussions in classes and on the dedicated social apps;
- learning how to act during an emergency: during the LTTAs, students and teachers visited Fire Departments, Red Cross and Civil Protection; they could watch people while they are giving first aid, participated in emergency and first aid situations wearing firefighters clothes, and in workshops and drills carried out by doctors and nurses, firefighters, Civil Protection and Red Cross volunteers, students' peer who already volunteer in these organizations;
- the creation of the short course book entitled **"A More Secure World: Our Shared Responsibility – Are you prepared? Know what to do in time"**, which contains an introductory article from BBC on climate change and its effects on our planet, a dictionary of words related to natural disasters, lesson plans on natural disasters, emergency education and first aid, evacuation plans, survival kit, emergency teams. Each lesson plan includes suggested activities for teachers and project works. It is intended to be used by all teachers and students regardless of their school level, using the CLIL methodology or their translation into the partners languages. It is accompanied by Digital Games that can be used as an assessment tool and by a Survival Guide. These three useful tools will be disseminated in both digital and paper format. Copies will be printed using this project implementation funds and will be distributed in schools. Furthermore, at the beginning of the new school year 2023–2024, the project coordinators will present them to the teaching staff and to the science and foreign language departments and will propose their inclusion in the school curriculum so that they can be carried out within the classrooms. Workshops on safety and emergency education in schools and on first aid will be organized, in collaboration with the Red Cross and the Civil Protection and the active participation and voluntary actions of our young people within these organizations will be promoted.

The visits to the Firefighter Departments, Red Cross, Civil Protection and the workshops held by experts allowed us, teachers, and students, to learn on the field how to behave in case of a disasters and how we can provide help to injured or sick people. Observation and practice are the best way to acquire knowlege and competence on such an important matter.

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Project Results

For space and size reasons these project results cannot be contained in this publication and are therefore published on another publication entitled **"A More Secure World: Our Shared Responsibility – Are you prepared? Know what to do in time"**, which contains the Lesson Plans and the links to the Digital Games and the Survival Guide.

Both the Lesson Plans and related Digital Games, and the Survival Guide will be disseminated in digital and paper format. Copies will be printed using this project implementation funds and will be distributed in schools. Furthermore, at the beginning of the new school year 2023-2024, the project coordinators will present them to the teaching staff and to the science and foreign language departments and will propose their inclusion in the school curriculum so that they can be carried out within the classrooms. Workshops on safety and emergency education in schools and on first aid will be organized, in collaboration with the Red Cross and the Civil Protection and the active participation and voluntary actions of our young people within these organizations will be promoted.

The Book: it is a formal intellectual output that contains all the documents, analysis, official reports, examples of best practices, etc. produced during the implementation of the project.



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End Magazine: it is an informal output containing photos, videos, comments and messages produced by the students during the implementation of the project (LTTAs).



“A More Secure World: Our Shared Responsibility – Are you prepared? Know what to do in time”: it is a formal output – a short course book – that contains an introductory article from BBC on climate change and its effects on our planet, a dictionary of words related to natural disasters, the same dictionary in the partners languages, both created by our students, the lesson plans created by the partner students and teachers, the links to the genially games and survival guide created by our students.



Assessment through gamification: they are two sets of games created by our students on the topics dealt with in the lesson plans – natural disasters, what to do in case of a natural disaster, first aid in case of an emergency.



Survival Guide: it is a very practical booklet created by our students and intended for the young that, using a very simple language, provides definitions of the main types of disasters identified during the implementation of the project, an emergency training program (what to do in case of a disaster?), some “first aid” actions illustrated by drawings, the survival kit, European and national emergency contact numbers to be called in case of an emergency.



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Dissemination of "Help me!" Project

The very first dissemination of our "Help me!" project started when we received the official communication of its approval from the National Agency: the news was spread among the school and local communities by means of posts on our schools websites, circular letters and articles published by local newspapers. The project was also presented to parents and promoted among teachers and students and both were invited to join it.

When its implementation started, dissemination activities were agreed upon among the partners and the following dedicated tools were created with teachers and students taking care of them in line with the project instructions:

- Erasmus project corner;
- project website;
- eTwinning page;
- Facebook page;
- instagram page;
- twitter page.

In addition to the joint activities above, each partner school has used its own strategies to promote and disseminate the project. The dissemination activities were related to the project theme, but also to the Erasmus+ programmes in general. The aim was to familiarise the public with the objectives and results of the "Help me!" project, but also to increase the visibility of Erasmus+ projects and motivate the general public to get involved in their implementation.

The latter was born from the implementation of the project "Help me!", in order to start making small gestures, such as separate waste collection, as a contribution to reduce the disastrous effects of climate change. The local councilor for environmental policies, Dr. Salvina Mancinelli, attended the presentation;

22 April 2022: on the occasion of the "Earth Day 2022", the project "Help me!" and "IIS Mandralisca is my green school" were presented to the local community at Cefalu City Hall;

May 2022: "Let's meet up!" was an activity carried out during the mobility in Cefalù to enhance a positive relationship among students through active interaction and cultural exchange. During the activity the students from participating countries spent 1 hour with the students of each of the classes of Liceo Classico Mandralisca: they presented their countries and schools, promoted and attracted the interest of the students to the 'Help me!' project and interacted with the students on topics of interest,



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November 2022: the mayor of Cefalù, Mr Daniele Tumminello, was invited to take part in the students general assembly on November 29 as a guest speaker, the project presented, the mayor invited to talk about Cefalù evacuation plans;

a presentation on the state of the project was made to the municipal council (mayor, town planning councilor, environmental policies and culture and public education councilors) on the occasion of a meeting on emergency management by the municipality of Cefalù;

presentation of the project to the Cefalù civil protection volunteers "Giubbe d'Italia";

13-14 October 2022: our participation in the Erasmus Days and International Day for Disaster Risk Reduction was an opportunity for students to socialize the experiences made during the mobilities and to put the topics covered by the Help me project as topics for debate;

May 2023 presentation of the project and its outcomes to the Polish, Romanian, Macedonian, Dutch and Turkish partners of the Erasmus+ project KA220 KA220-SCH, 2021-1-PL01-KA220-SCH-000023916, "Teaching History for Disabled Students through Digitized Gamification Tools ", during the latter's mobility in Holland. In particular, colleagues were involved in the digital game on Emergency Education, which they found fun and useful. The digital game link was shared with the partners who expressed their intention to use it in the classroom with their own university students and students with disabilities.

Furthermore, each mobility was socialized with posts on the school website and upon returning from each mobility articles were published in the local media, students were asked to write a short comment which was socialized on the project's social channels; pptx presentations and reports on the mobilities were made by the students during general assemblies and in classes.

The students involved in the project ranked first at the 'Green Game Digital' on recycling, others ranked among the first 20 schools in a contest on sustainability (Olimpiadi della sostenibilità); we also participated in the Earth Days, International Day for Disaster Risk Reduction and in the Q-Hack4.0 Call4Earth - Youth Hackathon for COP27, with students awarded as best participants.

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Srednja skola Mate Blazine Labin, Labin, Croatia

We carried out dissemination activities at local, regional, national, and international levels.

On its website, Mate Blažine Labin Secondary School informed the public about the implementation of the project activities from 2020 to 2023, about the objectives and results of the project and pointed out that the activities were funded by the European Union and implemented within the Erasmus+ KA2 programme. Within the school, the project activities were announced in the meetings of the Teachers' Council and individual meetings were held with colleagues who expressed the wish to participate in future Erasmus+ projects. For interested teachers from Mate Blažine Labin Secondary School, the coordinator of the Croatian partner for the Help me! project organised a presentation on Erasmus+ accreditations. The lecture was given on 7 July 2023 by Samanta Matejčić Čotar, Erasmus+ Ambassador of the Croatian Agency for Mobility and Programmes of the European Union (AMPEU).

The Help me! project also received the most coverage in the local and regional media. The pupils of the school who participated in the Help me! project won 2nd place at the BeSafeNet 2021 International Olympiad on Natural Disasters, organised under the Council of Europe Euro-Mediterranean Agreement EUR-OPA. The project was thus presented at the national level as part of the Civil Protection of the Republic of Croatia and also at the international level, as the mentioned activity indirectly emerged from the Help me project. When the award was presented by the Council of Europe, it was reported that the project itself encouraged students to participate in the BeSafeNet Olympiad and provided them with additional knowledge, and that the teachers of the Help me! project team for Secondary school Blažine Labin secondary school also mentored the students.

During the mobility in Croatia (14 May - 20 May 2023), civil society organisations and/or individuals that were collaborated with in the implementation of the project activities at local and regional level, namely the Labin Public Fire Brigade, the Labin Red Cross and the Istria County Emergency Medicine Training Institute, posted about the project on their Facebook profiles and/or websites. A roll-up banner of the project and promotional material - pens - were also created.

Several presentations about Erasmus+ programmes and eTwinning were given during the Help me project. Professors Karla Golja Milevoj and Laura Kokot gave the international presentation A bridge between eTwinning and Erasmus+ projects on 18.3.2021 and the online presentation Predstavljamo eTwinning škole on 30.3.2021. Professor Karla Golja Mileva gave a presentation on Erasmus+ and eTwinning projects (first steps) at Ivan Batelić Raša Primary School on 29.8.2021 with the aim of encouraging primary school teachers to get involved in Erasmus+ projects. In addition, the Erasmus+ projects of Secondary school Mate Blažine Labin were presented in a programme about education on national television on 10 February 2022. Together with the project partners, the Erasmus Days 2022 were celebrated in the way that each project partner held a debate on the topic in their school: The importance of disaster early warning systems and emergency plans.

Agreements will be signed with the local Red Cross and Civil Protection and regular drills and workshops on emergency education and first aid to be held during the school year. The students will be encouraged to volunteer in either organizations.

Presentation of the project and execution of the games On 11th September during the welcoming activities of the first classes students, the project and its outcomes will be presented, the digital games played with the students.

The lesson plans, digital games and survival guide will also be published on the eTwinning platform and teachers from European countries will be invited to carry them out in their schools and provide comments on their effectiveness, suggest corrections and additional activities and games, provide information on their experiences and examples of best practices. Our hope is that a network will be created for our mutual benefit.
